Dear Parent

I hope everyone had an enjoyable and safe Easter break.

Thank you for your support of everything last term. A lot was organised and helped by ongoing/strong parental, staff and pupil input.

- The school had many individuals who achieved much success in various categories of Fermanagh Feis – choral, verse speaking, poetry etc. There were many entries representing this school from P1 to P7. The children were well prepared by Mrs West (formally Miss Williamson) and Mrs Johnston (Co-ordinators) and parents had a huge input – thank you. Our school choir reached a particularly high standard this year.
- 2. The Fermanagh and County Show was also supported and again, many entries from this school featured in each of the categories. It is hoped that all the prize winners will be acknowledged in August as well as having their work displayed for family/visitors to view.
- 3. The P.T.A. Easter Fair generated much interest. Thank you for the support. The number of people who attended was well above expectation.
- 4. We were delighted at the end of term when one of our P5 pupils (Sophie Cadden) received a prestigious Seamus Heaney prize for her poetry witing (overall province winner in this category). This followed a N.I. Arts Council 'Poetry in Motion' programme which the P5s have been engaging in this year alongside many primary schools from elsewhere in the province. Well done to Sophie and pupils in P5.

Thank you for being mindful of your child's engagement with social media. Issues can filter into school if children are given access to sites that are not age appropriate and when messaging becomes 'too free' and unchecked.

A new P.T.A. Committee will hopefully be established in the months ahead. The support/ commitment of an active P.T.A. has always been a huge strength of this school and it is vital (moving forward) that we try to keep this going. I would like to thank the current Committee members/helpers (and Mrs Clarke) for all that they have organised for the school this year – the Easter Fair alone required considerable input. I am also inviting other parents to register names - if interested in being part of the next P.T.A. committee (September on) please leave your details at the office for the attention of Mrs Clarke/Facebook message. Any parent who would be willing to help and not form part of the committee is most welcome – thank you.

Recently, the P.T.A. donated a cheque to the school for **£15,000** – a fantastic amount and very much appreciated. Regular P.T.A. donations like this enable us, for example, to replace reading and mathematics core material, purchase key assessment resources, fund swimming lessons in full, employ specialist coaches for P.E., subsidise many educational trips and offer some after school activities for free. The mounting cost of things in a school of this size and type is always increasing and yet funding from the Department of Education is, year-on-year, being scaled back. The forecast for next year shows trivial improvement.

The school endeavours to maintain exacting standards regarding **uniform and appearance**. <u>This policy is exceptionally well supported by parents of children who attend this school</u>. In term 3, I am keen that standards are maintained – uniform, black shoes, jewellery, no nail varnish etc. Appearance includes hair styles. **For safety reasons we prefer children to wear stud type earrings only (not hoops).** I am not interested in what might be acceptable in other schools – inevitably all schools vary in their policy/implementation of policy. The wearing of P.E. gear on designated P.E. days is allowed but given the warmer weather in term 3, we are reverting to just P.E. kits (there is no need to wear leggings under shorts).
